> 1 Further discussion arising from rate forum. "What you always wanted to know about rates but were too afraid to ask." At our February meeting guest speaker Peter Hann senior valuer from Hann MacKenzie Associates delivered a clear and pragmatic presentation so members left with a much greater understanding of how properties are valued and the consequences of land value. This presentation will be reviewed.

CoGG are of the opinion that they serve us well in both the cost of the rates and in the services offered. They say our rates have increased about the $4.5 \%$ mark for the last decade and that this is well below the state average of $6.5 \%$. CoGG also believes that the funding of many day to day activities in Barwon Heads plus the recent investment in the ELC shows that they are providing adequate services.
